Time Well Spent

Ephesians 5:15-17

INTRO:

- *Something that I have really come to understand better the older I get is how FAST time goes by!
 - *we are 1/4 way finished with 2017
 - *6 mos. from 5yr anniversary here
 - *Jenna and I will celebrate 15 yr. anniversary this year
 - *My oldest is only 1yr from being a TEENAGER!
- *The older I get, the more I realize the truth of James 4:14 "what is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes."
- *The older I get, the more I realize that time is short and I need to make the most of my time.
- *The same is true as a believer <u>time</u> is <u>short</u>, <u>our life is short</u>, and <u>we need</u> to <u>spend it well for</u> the <u>sake</u> of the <u>gospel</u>.
- *As we continue in our series on Biblical stewardship, we are going to make a transition.
- *This morning, and for the next 3 weeks, we are going to <u>transition</u> to <u>look</u> at <u>how</u> we <u>invest</u> the <u>gospel</u> we've <u>been entrusted thru</u> the <u>use</u> of our <u>time, talent</u>, & <u>treasure</u>.
- *We are going to start by looking at the use of our **time** for the advancement of the gospel.

*READ Eph. 5:15-17

BRIDGE:

- *The <u>book</u> of **Eph**. Is <u>written</u> to the <u>church</u> in <u>Ephesus</u> & the <u>purpose</u> is to <u>get them</u> to <u>understand</u>
 who they are as believers <u>and</u> what they have as believers <u>&</u> how they should respond to
 who they are and what they have.
- *In Ch. 4 & 5, Paul tells them how they are to walk in other words how they should live.
- *This is dealing with how they should spend their time as believers.
 - *in unity Ch. 4 *in love 5:1-7
- *in light 5:8-14
- *in wisdom 5:15-21
- *And it is in the context of His instructions on how to spend their time wisely that we find this exhortation: "walk carefully, not as fools, but as wise redeeming the time..."
- *ILLUST. Have you ever spent a lot of time on something, and then realized it was a waste of time? cleaning out garage just to have it filled up again!
- *This morning, I want us to see 2 important truths from our texts that teach us about spending our time wisely for the sake of the gospel.
- *In <u>order</u> for us to <u>spend</u> our <u>time</u> <u>wisely</u> **we 1st must**:

1. Be Wise! - v. 15,17

- *The 1st step to spending our time wisely for the sake of stewardship of the gospel is to be wise and Paul says that wisdom is "redeeming the time".
- *This Greek word for "redeem" is only used 4 times in the N.T. & in only 2 ways:
 - **A.** In relation to the redemption of man work of Jesus means "to pay price to recover from power of others."
 - **B.** In relation to believers & their time and in that sense it is means: "to make wise & sacred use of every opportunity for doing good."
- *So the idea is, to be wise w/ our time, we need to make good use of it!
- *Here's the problem we <u>often</u> <u>spend</u> so much of our time on <u>other things</u> that we <u>leave</u> VERY LITTLE room for God or for Him to use us in **His** ministry.
- *Let me give you something to think about:
- *THE AVG. LIFESPAN is now 78.5 years & here is some of how that time is spent:
 - *26.25 years or 229,950 hours sleeping
 - *9.18 years or 80,417 hours watching TV
 - *6.54 years or 57,290 hours on social media
 - *3.23 years or 28,295 hours surfing the internet
 - *1.96 years or 17,191 hours on sports & leisure
- *NOW COMPARE THIS: The AVG. Christian in USA:
 - *178.58 DAYS or 4, 286 minutes on ALL religious activities (church, prayer, Bible study, evang.)
- *The point is this: as believers we are told to "redeem our time" to make most of it for sake of gospel.
- *YET, wout a doubt, we spend FAR MORE TIME on other "unnecessary things" NON ETERNAL than we do on "spiritual things" in our lifetimes.
- *FOR HEAVENS SAKE: we <u>spend</u> 398 days ON THE TOILET which is DOUBLE <u>what</u> we <u>spend</u> our <u>time</u> on the <u>gospel</u> <u>either for ourselves or for others!</u>
- *So, if we are going to "use our time for the stewardship of the gospel", we **HAVE** to be wise with our time and being wise is "making the most of our time" (redeeming it!).
- *BUT WHY? Leads me to 2nd thing: not only do we need to BE WISE, but we also must:
- 2. Be Understanding v. 16, 17
- *As we get ready to close, let me share w/ you WHY we need to make the most of our time.
- *In our text, Paul gives us 2 reasons that will give us the understanding we need:

A. Days are Evil – v. 16

- *Most of us would agree with that statement at face value the days are evil we see it everywhere!
- *The word here for "evil" can mean 2 things depending on who is being affected.
- *If it is believers that are being affected (which it is in our text) it means "full of hardships, annoyances, toils, perils, etc. that lead to pain, suffering, &/or death"
- *So for us, we <u>need</u> to <u>make</u> the <u>most</u> of our <u>time</u> b/c of the hardships we will face that <u>cause pain</u>, <u>suffering</u>, and even death.
- *Here is the point: in our life as believers, we are going to face lots of hardships and in those hardships it is VERY difficult to focus on the needs of others.
- *ILLUST. Calvary, Sulphur split called Bro. Dan, he had just resigned, and told me that he was sorry, but just didn't feel like he could be of use to me b/c of his own issues.
- *SO, we need to use our time wisely WHEN THINGS ARE FINE!
- *We <u>need</u> to <u>make</u> **most of our time** b/c <u>with everything</u> we <u>have going</u> on <u>around</u> us, <u>we</u> **don't**have <u>time</u> to <u>waste</u>...when we have the time USE IT!
- *AND step up when others are struggling BRO. CHUCK text when Jenna was in hospital
- *Not only do we need to spend time wisely b/c the days are evil, BUT ALSO:

B. Will of God - v. 17

- *What is the will of God?
 - 1. To use US as His ambassadors of the gospel 2 Cor. 5:18-20
 - 2. Save Sinners 2 Pet. 3:9
